#### Boys:

Red/white pin-stripped shirt  
College black jumper  
Tailored black trousers/shorts  
Black shoes: leather or leather look. No canvas, trainers, logos or markings

Black trousers or skirt

## National Junior Indoor Rowing Championships

On the 16th and 17th March, the West Country schools were heavily represented at the National Indoor Championships (NJIRC) in London. British Rowing Coach Kevin Sellar and members of the Plymouth Schools Sports Partnership (SSP) took 41 rowers from 15 schools across Devon and Cornwall, to compete in both individual and team races.

KCC were represented by Lewis Sharam (Year 11), Henry Blake and Jake Goode-Gray (both Year 9). The boys competed strongly in the individual events, all coming in the top 20 nationally for their respective age groups: Lewis 16th, Henry 19th and Jake 12th.

The year nine boys having only practised once as a team together stepped up to the mark and won the Year 7-9 boys sprint relay, rowing strongly together and solidly taking the Gold medal. The changeovers for the team were faultless, it certainly wasn't a quiet race!

In all, 41 rowers in the South West squad took 29 medals home, breaking last year's total of 26 medals, and the largest medal haul in 11 years.

The South West once again showing its strength in the depth for the sport. The determination, effort and support from each athlete clearly paid off in many personal bests and appearances on the podium. Well done !

Science Week House Competition starts on Tuesday 6th June with events in the Library, outside and in the Science building every lunch time during the week. There is a closing event which will take place on Saturday 10th June, 10.00-12.30. Everyone can attend whatever their age. The whole week will be filled with science activities, demonstrations and games.
